- POSITION:** Assistant Professor of English, tenure-eligible.
- BEGINNING DATE:** Late August 2012
- QUALIFICATIONS:** Ph.D. Emphasis in American literature, with strong secondary expertise in creative and/or expository writing, with possible supporting strengths in film or environmental literature.
- RESPONSIBILITIES:** Full-time teaching load of six courses annually, to include one section each semester of Paideia 111-112, the college's two-semester required common, writing-intensive introduction to the liberal arts, as well as contributions to other interdisciplinary programs. Additional duties include advising and committee work.
- SALARY:** Commensurate with academic qualifications and professional experience.
