- POSITION:** Assistant Professor of Sociology in the Department of Sociology, Anthropology and Social Work, tenure-eligible.
- BEGINNING DATE:** Late August 2012
- QUALIFICATIONS:** Ph.D. is required by September 1, 2012. The successful candidate should demonstrate a commitment to teaching excellence and to maintaining an active scholarly agenda. Specialization in social statistics and research methods is preferred. Other areas are open. We seek a teacher-scholar who is well versed in the fundamentals of the discipline, and is interested in inclusive and innovative pedagogy. The sociology program consists of three full-time faculty and seeks to offer students a broad-based curriculum by faculty with diverse research interests.
- RESPONSIBILITIES:** Full-time teaching load: 6 courses divided over fall, January and spring terms. Teaching load will include Research Methods, Social Statistics, Introduction to Sociology, electives that complement existing offerings, as well as contributions to the interdisciplinary programs of the college. Additional duties include advising and committee work.
- SALARY:** Commensurate with academic qualifications and professional experience.
