

WIGELAND/AMERICAN-SCANDINAVIAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Wigeland/American-Scandinavian Prize for Study in Scandinavia (Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway, Sweden)

1. Eligibility - In order to be eligible for the nomination or application, the person must have at least one full year of full-time study at Luther College, hold a minimum junior standing at the time to the intended study, have demonstrated interest in concentrated study in Scandinavia, and present an outstanding academic record. Applicants shall not be restricted with respect to intended major provided they meet the eligibility requirements listed above. Normally, eligibility for consideration will terminate two years after awarding of the B.A. degree from Luther. Funding may only be used for programs beginning after June 1, 2021.
2. Nomination Procedure - Nomination for the prize may be made by anyone. Persons making nomination should submit a letter of nomination to the Office of the Dean, containing in addition to the student's name, information concerning the worthiness of the candidate.
3. Application Procedure - Persons wishing to apply either by virtue of their own interest or by nomination should submit the following information to the Office of the Dean (Dahl Centennial Union 262):
 - a. an application form
 - b. two letters of reference
 - c. a current official transcript

Application deadline is November 1, 2020

4. Selection Procedure - All materials shall be reviewed by the Honors Committee and they shall recommend to the president the name(s) of the recipient(s). (Luther College requested and was granted permission from the American-Scandinavian Foundation on September 13, 1983, to award prize money to "... the outstanding student or students in the study programs relating to Scandinavia at the College for a year of study in Scandinavia ...") The College shall have complete discretion in the selection of the recipient(s) of the prize. Announcement of the award(s) shall be made no later than December 20.
5. The Prize - The Prize shall be awarded to the recipient upon presentation of documentation that formal arrangements have been completed with the institution where the recipient intends to study. Upon presentation of documentation, 70 percent of the total award shall be made to the recipient. The remaining 30 percent will be paid upon receipt of the final report.

The size of the award will vary according to economic conditions and the number of scholarships awarded each year. It is expected that for 2021-22 the total amount awarded will be approximately \$4,000.
6. Reporting Requirements - At the completion of the year of study, each recipient is expected to submit a brief summary report to the Dean of the College detailing the year's study. A copy of this report will be sent to the American-Scandinavian Foundation.
7. Public Announcement - Public announcement of the prize shall take place at the College during the spring semester of the academic year in which the prize was granted.
