Luther Named One of the Best Colleges for Sustainability

The 2022 Sustainable Campus Index is out and this year, the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) named Luther College the fourth best baccalaureate institution in the nation for its efforts in sustainability.

"From sustainability scholarships to sheep grazing in our solar fields, Luther incorporates sustainability into all aspects of college life," said Jon Jensen, director of Luther's Center for Sustainable Communities.

Luther scored especially well in the Curriculum category and is ranked number nine of all colleges and universities in the nation. This category recognizes colleges with courses, programs or learning outcomes in sustainability. **At Luther, 37% of all courses include a**

Financial Reminders

- Students can grant proxy access to their NorseHub accounts so that parents or guardians can view financial aid offers, statement of account balances, and academic information electronically. Due to privacy rights, the college cannot share a student's information without their consent and the student can select the information that they want to share.
- Student account balances over \$1,000 (after scheduled payments) were assessed a \$100 late fee on Sept. 12. Payment plans are available. If you are concerned about your student's balance or being able to make a payment, please reach out to <u>studentaccounts@luther.edu</u> so that we can work with you and your student. We can set up a virtual meeting via Zoom, Google Hangouts, or simply talk over the phone.
- The 2023-24 FAFSA will be available for completion online at <u>studentaid.gov</u> beginning Oct. 1. Families will use 2021 Federal tax information to complete their FAFSA.
- Students with an outstanding balance due for Fall Semester or a J-Term Study Away need to secure a Federal PLUS or private loan now if they have not done so already.
- The Financial Aid Office has begun awarding endowed scholarships. In most cases, these scholarships do not increase a student's overall financial support; it is simply replacing a portion of a student's Luther Grant by identifying the actual source of the funding in the financial aid offer. Current levels of scholarship and grant assistance would not be possible without the generous support of donors.
- In August, the Biden-Harris Administration announced one-time student loan debt relief. More information can be found at <u>studentaid.gov/debt-relief-announcement/</u>. This relief applies to Federal Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Stafford Loans as well as Federal Direct Parent Loans for Undergraduate Students (PLUS).

A new version of <u>www.luther.edu</u> launched on August 31. It reflects Luther's latest strategies in messaging and branding, and new underlying technology (the WordPress content management system) that will benefit the college. While the homepage is directed primarily toward student recruitment, we also launched a special "gateway page" for parents and families. From the homepage, you can choose "Information for Parents and Families" to discover <u>programs, events, news, and information especially for parents and families</u>.

Note that as you dig into the Luther website, you will see different page structures and designs. Over the coming months, we will complete the process of migrating the entire Luther website into the new content management system.
