2023-24 LUTHER COLLEGE COST ESTIMATE WORKSHEET

How much should I expect to pay directly to Luther? This is one of the most frequently asked questions by students and families in planning for college. This worksheet should better assist you in understanding your total charges and the portion that will be covered by the financial aid offered to you. The remaining amount is your family's cost for the year. Review the information on the financial aid website, finaid.luther.edu, to fully understand what you have been offered and to explore other financing options that may be available to you and your family.

STEP ONE: ESTIMATE YOUR TOTAL LUTHER CHARGES FOR THE YEAR Tuition. Tuition is charged to all students and is based on the number of credits for which you		
enroll. If you plan to enroll full-time (minimum of 12 credits per semester and a maximum		
of 36 credits per year), your 2023-2024 tuition is:	\$49,650

Additional Fees. In addition to the mandatory Technology and Health & Wellness fee of \$650, additional fees may be charged according to your particular course work and activities. If you are taking private music lessons, add \$590 per semester for each credit of private lessons you are taking. Another common fee is an <u>optional</u> Co-curricular Activities Fee (CAF) of \$250. Refer to the Luther College Office for Financial Services website for a list of other additional fees.	\$

Total Grant Assistance. Include all grants and scholarships listed on your offer of assistance. Please note: Luther College requires that all outside agency awards be submitted to the Financial Aid Office. Federal regulations require that these funds be coordinated with your financial aid.	\$	
Norse/McElroy Loan. Include any Norse or McElroy loan listed on your offer of assistance.	\$	
Federal Direct Subsidized and/or Unsubsidized Stafford Loan. The Federal Direct Subsidized and/or Unsubsidized Stafford Loan requires an estimated reduction of a 1.057 percent origination fee. The total loan will be adjusted as shown (example: $6,500 \ge 0.9894 = 6,431$)	\$

<u>STEP THREE</u>: ESTIMATE WHAT YOU WILL PAY Subtract the total estimated credits from the total estimated charges to determine the approximate amount you will owe Luther College for the full academic year.		\$
Work-Study. Earnings are normally used to defray personal expenses during the school year. However, by participating in the Work Study Payment Agreement, you may contract to apply up to 90% of your work authorization to your statement of account by completing a Work Study Payment Agreement Application. (example: $$2,500 \times 0.90 = $2,250$)		\$
Subtract the work award earnings you'll contract through the Work Study Payment Agreement from the previous figure for a revised estimate of what you will owe the college for the year.		\$

Other Expenses to Consider. It is a good idea to work out your own personal budget each year so you'll know ahead of time what your total out-of-pocket expenses will be. For the academic year, we estimate the cost of books and supplies at \$1,040, transportation at \$1,290, and personal expenses at \$1656. These expenses will vary according to individual needs. You should plan to bring funds with you to cover your fall books and initial personal expenses.
