WHAT IS THE Honor Code?

A student-initiated commitment to "academic integrity"—being honest in our educational work. Violations of Luther's Honor Code are referred to and reviewed by the student-led Honor Council.

EXAMPLES OF ACADEMIC INTEGRITY VIOLATIONS

Using AI when prohibited, or using AI differently from what is allowed

- Copying someone else's work or answers
- · Helping others to cheat
- Using information from others about tests or assignments already completed
- Copying from the internet or other sources without acknowledgment
- Using unauthorized material, or unauthorized help, on an assignment
- Faking illness or making other false claims to postpone a test or assignment
- · Not reporting someone else who cheated
- Intimidating someone to prevent them from reporting an Honor Code violation

HOW TO AVOID ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

- · Read each syllabus carefully
- Only use AI as permitted in each course
- · Plan ahead; don't wait until the night before
- Ask your professor for help
- · Cite sources when you "cut and paste"
- · Complete assignments on your own, unless otherwise noted
