IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Courses that fulfill Luther College general education requirements must carry 3 or more credits and a grade of C- or higher.
- No more than one literacy, Global Engagement (GE), or Paideia requirement may be fulfilled by taking a single course; but a course that fulfills a literacy or GE can also be used to satisfy the Social & Environmental Justice requirement.
- With consideration to possible changes in the Normandale or Luther catalogs, this resource doesn't serve as official evaluation. Transfer coursework will be officially evaluated by the Luther Registrar's Office upon application/enrollment.
- This resource is compiled from Normandale courses that meet one or more MnTC goals. It's possible that courses not assigned to an MnTC goal could fulfill a Luther gen-ed. Such decisions would be made by the Luther Registrar's Office.
