LUTHER COLLEGE GENERAL EDUCATION: TRANSFER CHECKLIST FOR ROCHESTER COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE

Courses that fulfill Luther general education requirements must carry 3 or more credits and a grade of C- or higher.

No more than one literacy, Global Engagement (GE), or Paideia requirement may be fulfilled by taking a single course; but a course that fulfills a literacy or GE can also be used to fulfill the Social & Environmental Justice.

With consideration to possible changes in the catalogs, this resource doesn't serve as official evaluation. Coursework will be officially evaluated by the Registrar's Office upon application/enrollment.
