Transfer coursework will be officially evaluated by the Luther Registrar's Office upon application/enrollment.</p> <p>-This resource is compiled from RCTC courses that meet MnTC goals. It's possible that courses not assigned to an MnTC goal could fulfill a Luther gen-ed.
