

## LUTHER COLLEGE GENERAL EDUCATION: TRANSFER CHECKLIST FOR KIRKWOOD COMMUNITY COLLEGE

### IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Courses that fulfill Luther College general education requirements must carry 3 or more credits and a grade of C- or higher.
- No more than one literacy, Global Engagement (GE), or Paideia requirement may be fulfilled by taking a single course; but a course that fulfills a literacy or GE can also be used to satisfy the Social & Environmental Justice requirement.
- With consideration to possible changes in the Kirkwood or Luther catalogs, this resource doesn't serve as official evaluation. Transfer coursework will be officially evaluated by the Luther Registrar's Office upon application/enrollment.
- This resource is compiled from Kirkwood courses that meet the Kirkwood gen-ed. It's possible that courses not assigned to an Kirkwood gen-ed could fulfill a Luther gen-ed. Such decisions would be made by the Luther Registrar's Office.

**PAID 111D/112D, FIRST YEAR REQUIREMENT** Some students may be eligible to use one or two composition courses (taken post high school) for the fulfillment of one or both Paideias. Eligibility will be determined by admit status (number of transferred post-HS credits).
